

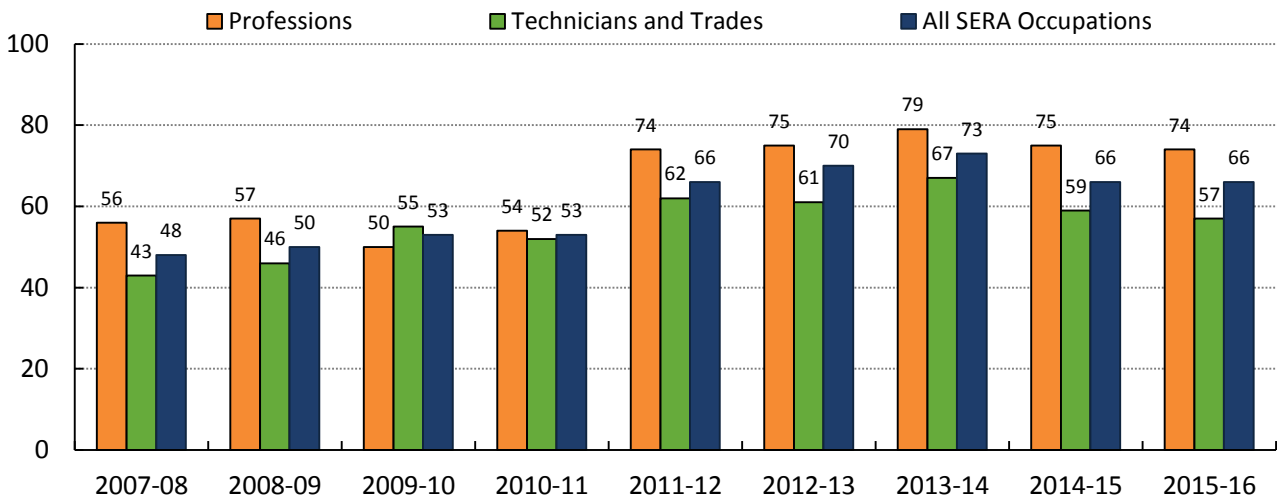

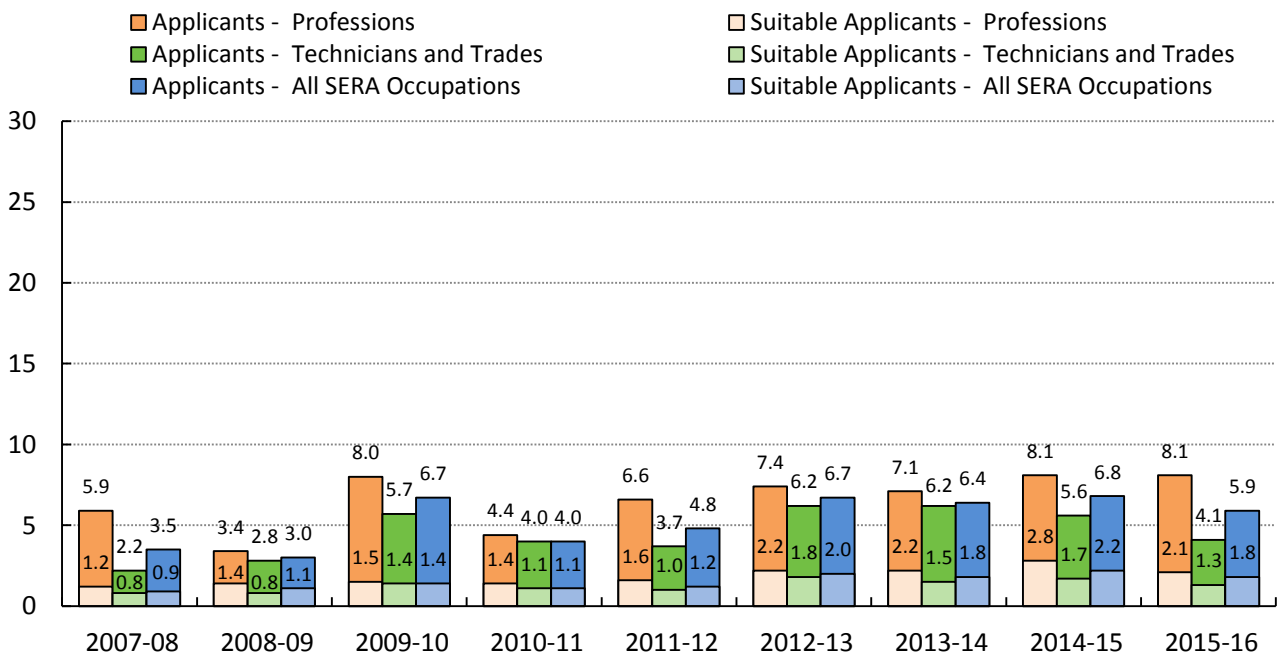

Technical Notes

These figures are a summary of the quantifiable results of the Department of Employment's skill shortage research programme, based on the Survey of Employers who have Recently Advertised (SERA). The programme assesses the labour market for around 100 skilled occupations, focusing mainly on Professions and Technicians and Trades, but also including a small number of management and other occupations.
